

These pictures can be used to talk/write about the rooms in a house and the items that can be found in different rooms.



Some ideas of questions you could ask:

- Point at a room on the picture- What room is this? How do you know? What things can you see in the room. Do we have things in our ___ that are not in this picture? Then continue the discussion by picking another room etc.
- Does our house look like this house? What things/rooms are the same? Does this picture have some rooms that we don't have?
- What is your favourite/least favourite room? Explain why.
- If you were building a house what types of rooms would it have?



Some questions you could ask:

- What rooms can we see in this house?
- Taking 1 room at a time: get them talking about the equipment/things that are specific to that room. For example for the kitchen you could ask:
 - What do we do in the kitchen usually?
 - Can you name anything in the kitchen?
 - What does the boy have on the table?
 - Point to the oven in the picture? What do we need this for?
 - One cupboard is up high. The door is open on it. Can you name any of the things inside this cupboard?
 - There is a book on the counter. What kind of book could it be? Do people use a special type of book in the kitchen? Why?
 - Do we have anything in our kitchen that is not in this picture?
- You could then ask similar kinds of questions to talk about the other rooms in the picture
